About the Marxe School

The Austin W. Marxe School of Public and International Affairs is New York City's only public graduate school dedicated to public affairs. Since 1994, we have offered an undergraduate degree in public affairs, a graduate-level MPA degree in public administration, and a Master of Science in Education in Higher Education Administration (MSEd-HEA). In the Fall of 2017, we launched a Master of International Affairs (MIA) degree program. We accepted our first cohort of students into the Online Master of Public Administration (OMPA) in the Spring 2024. We also have two certificate programs: the Certificate in Public Communication, and the Certificate in Quantitative Methods for Policy and Equity Analysis. We draw upon one of the largest public affairs faculty in the nation, and we apply an interdisciplinary approach to teaching, research, and professional development.
